- Ventura is the fastest warming county in the lower 48 and is at a higher risk of wildfires than 87% of U.S. communities.
- Fires are predominantly spread from indirect sources e.g., embers or home-to-home ignition (aka the "domino effect").
- Lemon Wood is near the Harmon Barranca, which is a fire threat:
 - The Southern California Edison easement is covered with "light-flashy fuels" between the community and the Eucalyptus tree windbreak (approx. 175 feet).
 - FUN FACT: Eucalyptus trees are very drought-resistant and the ones in Ventura won't enter into a drought state for another four years.



- If a house ignites, it will likely burn down, unless firefighters can stop it:
 - o Harden your house to prevent embers from igniting.
 - o Roofs are required to be Class-A rated.
 - o Attic vents attract embers.
 - Keep the first five feet around your house (Zone Zero) clear of anything that is combustible:
 - Patio cushion furniture usually ignites first.
 - Wood fences
 - Vinyl usually melts, but it can become hot enough to ignite something near it.
 - Woody plants, vines and trees:
 - "Ladder-fuel" is vegetation around the base of a tree that can ignite the tree.
 - Palms are combustible, especially ones that contain volatile oils, e.g., the Mexican Fan:
 - o Remove dead fronds and skin the trunks if possible.
 - Succulents are usually not highly combustible, but some contain volatile oils.
 - Grass/Turf:
 - Artificial: Can burn but is not a high heat generator.
 - Real: Not highly combustible when it's green but will burn when dry.
 - Keep it away from your house.
 - Leaf litter in gutters and on the ground
 - Combustible door mats
 - Wooden mulch (highly combustible and almost impossible to keep moist)
 - Plastic sheds
 - Firewood
